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MAJOR IN POLITICAL SCIENCE, LAW, POLITICS, AND GOVERNMENT CONCENTRATION

The Law, Politics, and Government concentration is designed to help students develop the knowledge and skills to analyze the connections between public law, political science, and government, and pursue careers in government or the legal profession. Students will learn about campaigns and elections, public opinion and voting behavior, American political institutions, American constitutional law, and how political forces contribute to public law in the United States, among other topics. Law, Politics, and Government students are strongly encouraged to complete an internship to gain practical experience working in the field.

- 6. Demonstrate confidence in describing the legal, political, and governmental processes of the United States.

Political science majors must achieve a minimum grade of C (2.000) in each of the political science (POLS) courses counted toward meeting the requirement of the major. Students may enroll in either the standalone major or (at most) one of the concentrations under the Major in Political Science.
